Update from Holcot Parish Council

My short update. The best way to keep track of the work of the Parish Council is to read the minutes of meetings and updates on the website. Parishioners are welcome to attend meetings.

Since the last newsletter Trudi Townsend has resigned. Our thanks to Trudi for everything she has done as a Councillor. A co-option process for a replacement Councillor is underway.

Road safety in Holcot - This continues to be a priority.

Since the last newsletter the white lines have been repainted, the HGV survey was completed and a short community Speedwatch was undertaken. The latter two of these involved people from across our community – it was great to see people participating. The outcomes have been posted on the website, but needless to say we have again demonstrated to the authorities that vehicles travel at excessive speeds through Holcot, and a substantial number of HGVs flout the 7.5t regulations.

We continue to await news about the priority chicane on Sywell Road. Northamptonshire Highways are being split into West Northants and North Northants Highways aligned to the unitary councils, and the new contracts supporting this reorganisation commence in the Autumn. Despite our protestations, there will inevitably be yet another hiatus.

We hope that we will be able to access further money to support additional road safety measures – the Parish Council will agree the current 'priority list' of measures at the September meeting, with a view to working through implementing these as funds allow.

Brief updates;

- The Annual Parish Meeting on 17 May was well-attended. The Police took questions and challenges from Parishioners, and responded positively wherever they could. As always, Parish Councillors fielded questions regarding their areas of expertise. The next Parish Meeting will be in May 2023.
- The Queen's Jubilee events went well, with new trees planted and gardens prepared, a lunch and concert, a barn dance, a parish photo, lighting of the church, and commemorative coins for Parish children. Thanks everyone for making this a success.
- Over the spring we've had people from Community Payback doing work tidying the playing field on occasional days. This has included painting equipment, clearing the surface of the basketball court, and gardening activities. The work was completed to a good standard.
- Asset Mapping Project we have undertaken work to map the assets across the Parish. Assets in this sense includes tangible things owned by the Parish such as the playing field equipment, but also services that we all rely upon and are of perceived value to Parishioners. There is an expectation that West Northants Council will wish to devolve activities to Parishes in the future, and whilst it is difficult to imagine what else could be devolved to Holcot, we contributed data to the project!

I wonder whether you have seen any of the images from the new Webb telescope? You can find loads at https://webbtelescope.org, like the Southern Ring Nebula (left) or of the "Cosmic Cliffs" in the Carina Nebula (right).



What do you think when you see images like these? What do you think when you consider our universe? Abraham Lincoln once wrote, *"I can see how it might be possible for a man to look down upon the earth and be an atheist, but I cannot conceive how he could look up into the heavens and say there is no God."* One light-year is approximately six trillion miles. Our galaxy - the Milky Way – is 100,000 light years across (that's 600,000,000,000,000,000,000 miles). And there are about 350,000,000,000 in the observable universe. Why would God create more than 350,000,000,000 galaxies (and this is a conservative estimate)? Maybe it is to make us say, "Wow, God is

unfathomably big?" Romans 1, in the bible, says, "Since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities – his eternal power and divine nature – have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made."

Charlotte Brontë, in Jane Eyre, wrote, "We know that God is everywhere; but certainly we feel his presence most when His works are on the grandest scale spread before us: and it is in the unclouded night-sky, where His worlds wheel their silent course, that we read clearest His infinitude, His omniscience, His omnipresence." Or perhaps God wanted us to see these pictures so that our response would be,

"Who do I think I am?" Psalm 8 says,

says, When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them,

human beings that you care for them?

Pondering the sheer size and beauty of our universe should humble us; we are infinitesimally small in comparison. Yet the bible tells us that the God who made it all cares for us. "If God has the power to create and sustain the universe, how can you or I think His power is insufficient for our daily lives? Nothing is
