Update from Holcot Parish Council

A short update as always, but a lot to cover.

Parish budget and precept for financial year 2023/24 – As you may have seen published on the website, at January's Parish Council we agreed our budget for next financial year, and set the precept (the amount of money we request through Council Tax).

For the past 6 years we have held the precept at £17,500 through careful budgeting and making savings wherever we can, whilst providing and paying for the services that Holcot needs. In the budget discussions it was very apparent that we must, reluctantly, increase the precept to £19,500. The increase is in-line with inflation and is expected to add around £10 to Council Tax for a Band D household.

Key budget items, excepting inflationary pressures, include road safety where provision has been made for the expected increase in costs for the Sywell Road chicane.

Road safety in Holcot - Despite multiple promises, WNC Highways have still not costed the priority chicane on Sywell Road. Enough said.

Potholes are appearing regularly on Holcot's roads—please report them on fixmystreet.com. WNC Highways then decide what action is required.

In recent years we have experienced flooding on Sywell Road near the washbrook. Grips, ditches and drains have been cleared, and recent rain hasn't given rise to any problems.

We have again registered for Speedwatch. We will be asking for volunteers to help later in the year.

You may have seen on the website and local media that this year's local policing priorities include road safety. We have written to Inspector Wakeman to remind him and his officers of how traffic speeds and HGVs affect our road safety, the history, and our plans. We have sought his help in getting some Police focus on what is our highest priority.

Brief updates;

- Charlie Heasman was co-opted to the Parish Council in November. Cllr Heasman has responsibility for
 the sector of all houses outside the village, and will represent the Parish Council in respect of the
 village hall. He will also take on the new responsibility focused on 'Climate Change and Environment'
 more on that below.
- Late last year I attended an excellent conference on how Parishes can act concerning climate change and the environment. Over the years we have taken some actions tree planting and LED lighting are two that come to mind but the Parish Council perceive that there is more that we could do. Other parishes have undertaken a variety of activities, including declaring a climate emergency to increase community focus, bee- and insect-friendly planting, large scale tree planting, and emissions-focused changes. It is clear to the Council that we need help to identify and implement practical opportunities. Consequently, we would like to establish a working group to achieve this. If you are interested in taking part, contact Charlie (charlesheasman@hotmail.co.uk).
- We have purchased and installed on the village hall a second defibrillator. It will be monitored by the
 group that already look after the defibrillator on the kiosk. We intend organising a life-saving training
 session in the spring.
- As for previous royal events, we are planning to support community events for King Charles's coronation. James Bonsor is co-ordinating Holcot's activities if you have ideas, or would like to get involved, please contact James (jamesbonsor@btinternet.com). A Barn Dance for Saturday 6 May is already booked, featuring Maggie Scott and The Occasional Few more details to follow.
- When we upgraded the very old streetlights in 2022 to more environmentally-friendly LEDs we had nine streetlights that were not upgraded because they were newer and reasonably energy-efficient. Coupled with our good fixed-price electricity contract effective until 2025, we have seen substantial savings from the LEDs, but expect that we are unlikely to get such a good electricity price from 2025. Consequently, we decided that we should upgrade these non-LED lights as soon as we can. We are unable to afford to replace all nine though five were upgraded to LED in late-January, with the remaining four planned for 2024.
- Each year the Chair of the Parish Council calls an **Annual Parish Meeting** of all electors. This year's meeting will be held on 24 May at 7:30pm in the village hall. More details will be published nearer the time, but please save the date.
