# Update from Holcot Parish Council

A longer update on behalf of the Parish Council this time...

**Budget 2024-25 and the Precept** – each year the Parish Council prepares a budget, and monitors against this as the year progresses. We regularly publish financial updates to the Parish Council page on the website, and report individual transactions in the Parish Council meeting minutes.

You will have seen on the website that the Parish Council determined in budget discussions that reluctantly we must increase the Precept (the Parish's share of council tax) by £2000 for the second year in a row. This is expected to impact annual Council Tax bills by about £11 for a Band D property.

Excepting the very apparent inflationary pressures, key budget items include increasing the road safety earmarked reserve to £10,000. More on this below.

**Road safety in Holcot** – always our top priority and financial/practical challenge.

The Sywell Road chicane construction was delayed until March due to "supply chain issues". The road closure will run from 11 March for 2 weeks.

I promised to report back on the impact of the 20mph advisory signs. Data from the mobile VASID shows that there has been no discernable impact on vehicle speeds. However, we don't know if there has been any impact on drivers' general behaviour and awareness.

The second solar-powered VASID, grant-funded by the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner, has been ordered and will be installed on Brixworth Road. On Brixworth Road over a third of traffic entering the village is speeding, with two-thirds exceeding the limit before the village gate on exiting Holcot.

The improved HGV 7.5t limit signage has been ordered by WNC, and will be installed. ANPR technology to monitor HGVs flouting regulations is still expected, although no date is available.

Recently it has become increasingly apparent that when utility companies dig up roads and footpaths they don't always repair them adequately. For instance, on Moulton Road near North Farm a dip appeared in the road shortly after installation of services, similarly on the footpath on Brixworth Road (both now fixed). We now understand better the warranty that contractors must provide (broadly, 2 years) and the process by which Highways monitor performance. Continue to report potholes through *fixmystreet* (button on the website homepage), and I suggest that where you know a pothole relates to recent utility works that you note that in the descriptive text.

If you have read recent Parish Council minutes on the website you will have seen that we have established a Road Safety Working Party of Councillors. We concluded that waiting for further section 106 funding from the house developers along the A43 was no longer a tenable position as we have the road safety problems now, and the Precept cannot cover the scale of works required. Consequently, the working party will be investigating whether there are alternative ways of achieving priority activities.

Holcot Parish Plan – you will find with this newsletter a short questionnaire intended to gather views about the key features of a Parish Plan. Once developed the Parish Plan will help guide the priorities and activities of the Parish Council over the next few years. Please help us by returning the questionnaire by March 28<sup>th</sup>. You can drop the questionnaire to either the Church Letter Box or to the White Swan.

**Pub drop-in** — we hold an annual drop-in event in the White Swan. It is an opportunity for you to informally meet Parish Councillors to discuss ideas for improving our community, any issues that you have, or where you might get involved in community activities. Also, this year you may want to chat about Parish Plan ideas or anything else mentioned in this newsletter. **The drop-in event is on March 28th at 6pm** for approximately an hour. Please save the date.

**Green Hill Solar Farm** – a project is commencing to build a solar farm across several Northamptonshire locations connected to a hub at Grendon. One solar array site is proposed to be on farmland to the south of Holcot. It is early days, but there is now a website with basic information <a href="https://greenhillsolar.co.uk/">https://greenhillsolar.co.uk/</a>. The formal consultation regarding the proposals is expected in the Autumn, and subject to national-level approval, construction will be towards the end of the decade. We are engaging with the applicants and will post further information on the website as it becomes available.

**Dog fouling** - You may have seen recently on the Facebook community page that dog poo continues to be a problem. Please pick up after your dog when it poos on footpaths or verges!

Using their Public Spaces Protection Order (search for "PSPO" on WNC's website), WNC are responsible for dealing with any problems. Amongst other things, the order specifies where dogs are allowed (not in playing

fields for instance), the requirement to keep dogs on a lead in public places, picking up poo, and carrying the means to do so. It also covers smoking prohibitions in certain places (e.g.; children's playgrounds). The PSPO is supported by a reporting process, £100 fixed penalty notices, and fines. Visit the WNC website to report offences.

To draw attention to the issue we have volunteers who highlight poo with coloured spray paint. If you would like to take a turn, please let Ruby (clerk@holcotvillage.co.uk) know and she'll put you in touch.

#### Brief updates;

- The final four streetlights owned by the Parish have been upgraded to LED.
- Each year the Chair of the Parish Council calls an Annual Parish Meeting of all electors. This year's
  meeting will be held on Tuesday 30 April at 7:00pm in the village hall. More details will be published
  nearer the time, but please save the date.
- We hold an annual community litter pick around the village. This year's event will be on Sunday 24
   March meet at the Village Hall at 11am. Picking equipment is provided, though I suggest bringing a pair of gloves. The litter pick takes less than an hour and is suitable for everyone. If we need to cancel the event due to the weather, a post will be published on the website. Please save the date.

**And finally...** the website is our key communications channel – if you haven't already, please sign-up on the website for email notifications of posts. Everyone is invited to attend Parish Council meetings to observe or speak (usually 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of each month in the Church Room – check the website for agenda). You can also read the meeting minutes on the website.
