"Holcot Hotspot"



Update from Holcot Parish Council

Elections 2025 - Local elections will be held on 1 May 2025. This includes elections for Parish Councillors. We need people from all backgrounds and experiences to put themselves forward to become a parish councillor. Councillors can make a huge difference to the quality of life of local people and how local issues are dealt with. Do you, or someone you know, have what it takes to be a local councillor? The deadline for candidates wishing to stand in the election to deliver their nomination papers to the Elections Authority; West Northamptonshire Council (WNC) is Wednesday 2nd April 2025 at 4pm.

Precept - the Parish Council has set the Parish precept at £22,250 for the financial year commencing April 2025. This is an increase of £750 (c3.5%) on the current year.

Green Hill Solar Farm – The proposal covers 3000 acres of farmland, primarily spread across Northamptonshire (a total area of 4 times that of Pitsford reservoir). Around 150 acres of solar panels and equipment are proposed in Holcot. Details of the applicant and the opposition group are on the website.

Following the community meeting in the village hall, the Parish Council responded to the statutory consultation before Christmas, setting out our opposition and objections to the scheme (see Green Hill Solar Farm page on the website). We also wrote to the Secretary of State, although we knew he wouldn't read the letter himself the messages were received by his office.

The next step is for the applicant to submit a Development Consent Order (DCO) to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS), expected now in April. We then register our interest with PINS for further consultation.

Road safety in Holcot —There has been no substantial change since last time. The Parish Council continues to seek clarity on the funding stream so that focus can be applied to the next priorities. On 14 February we are meeting our MP to outline the issues and ask for help in moving us forward. In February, WNC are commencing their research into automated enforcement of the HGV restrictions.

Brief updates;

- *Pub drop in* each year the Parish Council holds a drop-in event in the White Swan, to allow informal chats about the anything that Parishioners want to discuss. The drop-in event is on 13 February 6pm-7pm.
- Litter pick This year's litter pick is on 23 March at 11am. Equipment is provided, and with enough people the whole pick within the 30mph zone typically takes around 30 minutes. Meet at the Village Hall.
- Annual Parish Meeting This year's Annual Parish Meeting is on Tuesday 8 April at 7pm in the Village Hall. We are inviting the Police and WNC Highways to report again watch the website for the agenda.

Why I Believe Jesus Really Rose Again, and Why It Matters. I know, I know. 2025 has only just begun. We've only just got past Christmas. Why am I thinking about Easter already? Maybe it's the shops already stocking mini eggs and cream eggs. In truth, Christians don't really ever stop thinking about Jesus rising again, because the resurrection of Jesus is the cornerstone of the Christian faith.

But is it reasonable to believe it actually happened? And even if it did, why should it matter to anyone today? Let's start with the evidence. The accounts of Jesus' resurrection are rooted in history. The Gospels were written by people who either knew Jesus personally or carefully recorded the testimonies of those who did. These texts describe Jesus' crucifixion, burial, and the astonishing claim that He rose from the dead three days later. Critics often argue that the resurrection is a myth or fabrication, but this raises questions: why would early Christians, many of whom faced persecution and death, invent such a story? If their aim was to gain power or popularity, they failed spectacularly by earthly standards. Furthermore, the Gospels reveal embarrassing details — such as Jesus' followers initially doubting the resurrection — which no propagandist would include. One striking piece of evidence is the empty tomb. Opponents of Christianity in the first century didn't deny the tomb was empty; they tried to explain it away. The most plausible explanation is the one given by Jesus' disciples: He rose again.

Then there are the eyewitnesses. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, written around 20 years after Jesus' death, lists over 500 people who saw the risen Christ. Many were still alive at the time, inviting readers to verify the claims. Such public testimony would be risky if untrue.

But why does this matter? The resurrection is more than a historical curiosity; it's the foundation of hope. It declares that death doesn't have the final word. If Jesus rose, it means God is real, sin and evil can be defeated, and there is life beyond the grave. It also means Jesus' teachings about love, forgiveness, and justice carry divine authority.

For me, the resurrection transforms life's struggles. In moments of grief, doubt, or failure, I find hope in the promise that God is making all things new. The resurrection assures me that love is stronger than death, and that the world's brokenness isn't the end of the story.

You might be skeptical, and that's okay. But if there's even a chance the resurrection is true, isn't it worth exploring? The answer could change everything. **Rev. David Reith.**
