Update from Holcot Parish Council

A short update this time...

Elections 2025 - Local elections will be held on 1 May 2025. After then we will have a shiny new Parish Council.

As there were eight nominations for eight seats the election is uncontested and nominees are duly elected. Thank you everyone who has put themselves forward.

Special thanks to those who have stood down from the Council at this election – thank you for your service.

Green Hill Solar Farm – The proposal covers 3000 acres of farmland, primarily spread across Northamptonshire (a total area of 4 times that of Pitsford reservoir). Around 150 acres of solar panels and equipment are proposed in Holcot. Details of the applicant

Recently Green Hill Solar have held a targeted consultation. Their next step is to put forward to the Planning Inspectorate a draft Development Consent Order after which the Planning Inspectorate start detailed work. This will include further consultation.

Road safety in Holcot –There has been no substantial change since last time. The Parish Council continues to seek clarity on the funding stream so that focus can be applied to the next priorities – currently there are still technical matters to be resolved between WNC and the developers, which affects our access to s106 funding.

In the meantime, we have again met with Highways regarding road safety and maintenance, and met with our MP to help us drive forward road safety measures.

Hope at the Cross

If you've ever stood in silence at a war memorial, watched the news, or faced personal grief, you'll know that the world can be a painful place. There's much to celebrate—acts of kindness, love, and beauty—but also suffering we can't ignore. Maybe you've asked: *Why is the world like this? And is there any hope?* Christianity takes these questions seriously. At its heart is not just a set of beliefs, but a person—Jesus. His life was extraordinary, but it was His death that changed everything.

Jesus was executed on a Roman cross, a brutal punishment reserved for the worst criminals. Yet, He was no criminal. Even those who sentenced Him admitted as much. Pilate, the Roman governor, declared Him innocent but caved to public pressure. Why, then, did He die?

Jesus' death wasn't a tragic accident; He claimed it was the very reason He came. He spoke of giving His life "as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45). In other words, He died for us. The Bible explains that our greatest problem isn't just the brokenness around us, but the brokenness within us—our rebellion against God, which the Bible calls sin. We all know what it's like to feel guilt, shame, or regret. The Bible says this comes from being disconnected from the God who made us. But rather than leaving us to face judgment, Jesus stepped in. This is the heart of Christianity: not rules or rituals, but a rescue. It's not about what we do for God, but what He has done for us. And it changes everything.

Perhaps this is new to you, or perhaps you've heard it before but dismissed it. Maybe you have questions or even doubts. That's okay. Jesus didn't come for those who have it all figured out, but for those who are searching. His invitation is open to all: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

So, where do you stand? You might not consider yourself religious, but this isn't about religion—it's about truth. If what Jesus said is true, then it's the most important news in the world. It's worth exploring. **Rev. David Reith.**
